Peter Goldberg of Milwaukee-based Families International Inc. named to *The NonProfit Times* Power & Influence Top 50 list for seventh time

MILWAUKEE — Aug. 5, 2009 — Peter Goldberg, president and CEO of the Milwaukee-based nonprofit Families International Inc., has been named to *The NonProfit Times* Power & Influence Top 50 list for the seventh time.

This 12th annual national list, selected by the contributing editors of *The NonProfit Times*, includes a variety of nonprofit leaders selected for their current impact and the innovative plans they have for the future. According to *The NonProfit Times*, “Executives who mobilize the masses for good and who manage their resources while blazing a path for others to follow make up the Power & Influence honorees this year.”

Goldberg, a Mequon resident, has been president and CEO of Families International since 1994. Families International is the nonprofit parent organization for four Milwaukee-based organizations: the Alliance for Children and Families, United Neighborhood Centers of America (UNCA), Ways to Work, Inc., and FEI Behavioral Health.

Families International manages the financial, human resources, administrative, risk management, and information systems capacities for all the organizations, allowing each to maintain financial independence while also benefiting from the cost savings that result from pooling resources at the parent level. Goldberg, as president and CEO, helps Families International create and maintain an environment for sharing ideas, information, and other resources.

Prior to joining the Families International group of companies, Goldberg was president of the Prudential Foundation and head of Primerica's social responsibility programs.

Goldberg is a board trustee of The Bridgespan Group, chair of the advisory committee of the

Listening Post Project at the Center for Civil Society Studies at Johns Hopkins University, and convening chair of Leadership 18, a group that consists of the major national nonprofit human services organizations in the United States. He has served on numerous other nonprofit boards, including the National Human Services Assembly and Independent Sector, where he was chairman of the board.
